WORLD OF OUTLAWS SEASON HIGHLIGHTS 1997-2006

1997

Donny made the commitment to seek the "Manufacturers Rookie of the Year Award" in the World of Outlaw series and was part of the closest battle in the history of the Award. Donny finished the year with 3 top five finishes, 22 top tens, 57 top fifteens, 12 heat race wins his way to a 12th place finish in the driver point standings and a 197 point margin over Paul McMahan to earn the coveted Rookie Award.

1998

The "Sophomore Season" on the WoO tour was again challenging for this young team from North Dakota. By mid-season a number of changes were starting to pay off. The month of July was highlighted with a short-term sponsorship with ParkerStore and Donny being named "The North Dakota Athlete of the Year" for his accomplishments in 1997. Shortly thereafter, the team hired David Yingst to be the team's crew chief and the dividends came to as he earned a Fast Qualifier Award at I-55 Raceway in Pevly, MO. Donny showed some signs of maturity at the Knoxville Nationals passing sprint car legend Steve Kinser on his way to a fourth place finish in the Nationals. It was only a couple of weeks later when Schatz captured his first career WoO "A" Feature victory at Riverside Speedway in Cottage Grove, OR.

1999

The 1999 season began with a full time sponsorship partnership with ParkerStore and the combination of Donny and Dave Yingst proved to be potent with several top ten runs to begin the season. A March victory at Battleground Speedway near Houston kept the team's momentum rolling along during the early going. Returning home to Fargo in July in the top five of the standings really helped the team get through the tough summer schedule. A thrilling Knoxville Nationals, which included a strong qualifying effort and memorable 10th to 1st heat race charge, propelled the team through the Western Swing where Donny had a solid Gold Cup. He ended his season with major push sweeping the historic Western World Championships weekend at Manzanita and claiming the final World of Outlaws race of the century with his cowboy style ride on the rough Las Vegas Motor Speedway surface.

2000

After closing the 1999 season on such a high-note, Donny had high expectations heading into his fourth World of Outlaws season. New facilities at Charlotte and Ft. Worth and more live TNN telecasts offered a greater opportunity for more exposure. The early portion of the season was marked by motor problems. A fourth place finish in the first race at The Dirt Track at Lowe's Motor Speedway was a bright spot before the team changed personnel. Another lock-in finish at the famous Bristol Motor Speedway helped Donny and crewman Shane Anderson continue on during the dog days of June and into July where a second place finish in the Ethanol Classic at Knoxville was a preview of things to come. Veteran Crew Chief Kenny Woodruff joined the team at the Knoxville Nationals and after an impressive second place finish in his preliminary feature, he led the first 25 laps of the Nationals "A" before finishing second. In late September, Donny earned a historic victory winning the prestigious National Open at Williams Grove after starting 10th. Five nights later, he led all 30 laps to claim the opening night feature at Charlotte. The late season victories provided a boost as the team concluded the 2000 season and Donny earned the "Viviran Perseverance Award" at the season-ending WoO banquet.

2001

The 2001 season began with championship expectations and consistency early-on. An unbelievable charge from 11th to victory on a rubber-down Huset's surface in late April started a string of wins including a Williams Grove preliminary, Lebanon Valley, a charge from 10th to win on the dirt covered Bristol Motor Speedway and a victory at Heartland Park in Topeka. July 26 was a historic night as Donny won two features at "the Grove" and three nights later won at New Egypt Speedway. The team was on fire at the Knoxville Nationals blitzing the field the first two nights before losing a tire on the opening lap of Nationals "A" after starting on the pole position. Donny and the team regrouped and returned to victory lane three nights later at Metra Raceway Park in Billings, MT. Schatz continued to finish the season strong and finished a career-best fifth in the final WoO standings.

2002

After a slow start to the 2002 season, Donny and the team decided to switch to Hoosier Tires and the results picked up right away. Schatz nearly won at Houston Raceway Park coming home second in a photo finish to Mark Kinser. The team really found their rhythm in the Duel of Dakotas event where Schatz won his first WoO feature at Red River Valley Speedway in July. Four nights later, he won at Beaver Dam and continued consistently running in the top ten. A victory in the \$100,000 Historical Big One provided plenty of momentum and for the second consecutive year, Donny won his preliminary night feature at the Knoxville Nationals. The race saw Schatz, Tyler Walker and Danny Lasoski swap the lead before Schatz raced away to the win. Schatz chased down Steve Kinser in the Nationals "A", but had to settle for second. Donny nearly scored a second win at Riverside Speedway in OR before a broken crankshaft cost him the win. Following the West Coast swing, the team again changed the crew and finished the season with a few strong runs to come home seventh in the WoO standings.

2003

The 2003 campaign provided Donny an option to race in the USAC Silvercrown Series along with the World of Outlaws. Schatz continued to succeed with the Outlaws taking a March win at State Fair Speedway in Oklahoma City, a preliminary feature at Eldora in April, a May victory at Lernerville and a hometown win in June. He began July by taking Sedalia feature and concluded it by dominating the Williams Grove Summer Nationals. Another Knoxville Nationals prelim victory and runner-up finish in the "A" preceded a Rocky Mountain Speedway win. Donny won a thriller at Eagle in September before winning the opener of the National Open weekend to give him a career-high 12 feature events. He finished fifth in the final standings.

2004

After a career high in wins and a second full season with the team in tact, Schatz and the team looked to challenge for the WoO crown. The early season provided mixed results with some consistency and some misfortune. The early season highlight was Donny's charge from sixth to beat Steve Kinser on his 50th birthday at Rolling Wheels Raceway on June 2. A preliminary win at Calistoga on September 3 was the breakthrough night that started an incredible four-race winning streak. Donny swept the Gold Cup at Chico and the 1/3-Mile Nationals at Eagle. Two more wins in Pennsylvania, first at Port Royal and two nights later he won his second National Open, helped continue the late season push. Schatz concluded the season by winning the finale at Las Vegas Motor Speedway and finished a career-best third in the WoO standings.

2005

The 2005 campaign kicked off with Donny taking the Outlaws Down Under II finale at Parrmatta City Raceway in January. The first night back on US soil provided a hint of foreshadowing into the frustrations that were ahead in 2005. Schatz took command of the opening feature at Volusia Raceway Park seemingly on his way to his third consecutive WoO win and suddenly his ParkerStore sprinter lost power. A burnt coil wire cost him the feature that night, but the team bounced back taking wins on consecutive weekends in March at Las Vegas and Houston. Following the wins, the team struggled with consistency throughout April and May before reshuffling the crew. At his home track in July, it looked as though the team was back in form as he was dominant at Red River Valley leading the first 27 laps before once again a burnt coil wire cost him another hometown win. The following Friday night, Donny returned to victory lane at Route 66 Raceway and came back with a runner-up the following night at I-55. The rest of July was a struggle before the team brought in Ricky Warner to handle the crew chief duties starting at the Knoxville Nationals. The ParkerStore team responded immediately as Donny finished second in the Nationals for the fourth time in five years. The following week, Donny was leading the feature in Billings when another mechanical problem cost him a win. During the next two weekends, Schatz proved he was back by racing past Steve Kinser at both Elma and Calistoga to claim feature wins. The winning ways continued as Schatz took K-C before repeating his National Open triumph. He set a track record at Dodge City and won the opener at Tulare enabling him to finish fifth in the final standings.

2006

With the surge Donny concluded the 2005 campaign with, setting a goal of competing for the championship was top priority. Schatz started with a runner-up finish in Florida and then posted another at Tucson just days after riding with the Blue Angels. Five days later, he picked up his first WoO win of 2006 at Las Vegas Motor Speedway and took over the points lead. After finishing second the following night at Las Vegas, Schatz scored a weekend sweep taking feature events at Batesville and Pevly. Weather played havoc in April and May, but the ParkerStore team kept up the pace by winning at Grandview Speedway on May 16 and took the \$50K challenge at Sharon charging from 24th to 7th in 10 laps before contact ended his run. The state of New York was a great place for Schatz in 2006 as he dominated at Rolling Wheels on May 30. Coming off a second place finish at Beaver Dam, Schatz swept two races during the hometown "Duel in the Dakotas". Schatz became a Kansas winner at 81 Speedway during the end of June. Three nights after kicing off the "Month of Money" with a second at the King's Royal, Schatz chased down local favorite Ed Lynch, Jr. to win his first Don Martin Memorial Silvercup worth \$30,000. Two more New York wins were followed by a victory at K-C just before the Knoxville Nationals. After four second place finishes in the Nationals, Donny was the class of the field taking the sports biggest race. Five nights later, he was first in Rapid City, SD and then made a fantastic run from 14th to lead at his track of Nodak Speedway before blowing a tire. A win at Skagit kept his stranglehold on the points lead in late August. Following a horric fire at the Gold Cup, Schatz flexed his muscle by charging from 15th to win at Eagle and then won the following night at Jackson. He made it two straight at Knoxville during an October make-up feature and nearly had a clean sweep at Tucson two weeks later. Schatz concluded the 2006 season in style charging to win the season finale at Las Vegas before collecting his championship hardware the following night.
